Why Summer Camp?

Camp is one of the most effective environments in which young people develop, learn, and grow in faith. An expansive body of research shows that time spent at camp – and away from home! – helps kids grow. At Cedarkirk, campers will:

BUILD faith through shared relationships and experiences

GAIN respect for – and appreciation of – our planet

UTILIZE imagination, creativity, and play

BE VALUED for exactly who they are

CONSTRUCT and adhere to shared, communal values



LEARN social skills and nurture lasting friendships

BECOME more comfortable and confident in nature

DEVELOP lasting leadership skills

Regardless of the particular program they attend, every camper will try new things, find a voice in their small group, take on responsibility, explore their faith, and have the best time doing it!

The core of our summer program is the community that forms here each week among staff and campers in their small groups and we make sure every camper is a part of it. Your camper will do most activities with their small group, under the leadership of their counselors. In this setting, friendships and trust are built, and respect, learning, and care for one another thrives.

Most of a camper's day is spent in their small group at activities like archery, canoeing, Bible study, swimming, cook outs, and more. After dinner, small groups in the same age range will come together for supervised free time, worship, and night activities.

Cedarkirk's campers leave with a sense of accomplishment and a greater appreciation for their own abilities. They gain a deeper comprehension of their relationship with God and a new perspective on what they are capable of achieving.



Summer Theme: BEYOND BELIEF

What if God is bigger than you ever imagined? Beyond Belief invites campers to ask the big questions about God and explore how God can be seen in the vastness of creation, the power of community, and even their own hearts. This summer's curriculum will help us better understand the magnitude of God's grace and the ways in which each of us is guided and empowered to participate in God's vision for the world.



Cedarkirk campers take part in a daily Bible study with their small group as well as an evening worship with all the campers in their age range. Our goals are: to help campers understand they are loved by God for exactly who they are; that there are people who care about them and can support them in their practice of faith; and to equip them with the tools to shape their own faith and maintain it when they leave camp.

Cedarkirk's Summer Staff

Cedarkirk staff are equipped with the skills necessary to create a physically and emotionally safe environment within which all campers can thrive, grow, and have fun!



Our counselors are integral in shaping and upholding the community that forms here at camp. They are energetic, dedicated, Christian young adults who have committed their time and energy to caring for your child.

Each staff member goes through an extensive hiring process that includes personal interviews and fingerprint background checks. All staff receive twelve days of intensive training prior to the beginning of camp and ongoing instruction throughout the summer.



Training covers a diverse range of topics, including outdoor living skills, effective management of a small group and how to relate to the needs of individuals within that group, facilitation of all camp activities, positive discipline techniques, certification in first aid and CPR, and lots more.



JUNIOR CAMP SAMPLER

A low ratio of campers to staff ensures that every child receives the attention and nurture they need as they experience the excitement of camp for the first time!





CLIP campers continue to develop their leadership skills and strengthen self-confidence by spending part of each day shadowing and assisting counselors in our Junior and Explorer programs, then debriefing the experience afterward. Expect a rewarding week of challenge, growth, and fun! *This camp is only available to those who have completed two previous summers of SHL. CLIP campers receive 45 service hours for their work at camp.*



HIGH SCHOOL P.A.L.S. - NEW! (PEERS ACTIVELY LOVING & SERVING)

Campers in this service and leadership program will work together as a small group to act as buddies and peer leaders for our new Reach Out Junior program. The first few days of this camp will include training on how to work with campers in that program. Then, after our middle- and high-school Reach Out Junior campers arrive on Tuesday, P.A.L.S. will spend a portion of each day buddied up with those campers for recreation, activities, swims, and more. You have the privilege of welcoming a new generation of Reach Out campers to summer camp and helping make their experience a fantastic one! Of course, your group will still have plenty of time for all your favorite camp activities and the small-group experience you've come to expect from a week at Cedarkirk! *P.A.L.S. receive 30 hours of service for their work with these special campers!*

REACH OUT CONFERENCE




A supplemental application is required for these programs, which must be approved by camp staff to complete the registration. In order to create a safe place, free of distractions, Reach Out campers must be able to effectively communicate their basic needs and wants, maintain their own hygiene and bathroom needs, and be able to interact with peers and staff appropriately.

Additional Information



HEALTH & SAFETY

The health and safety of your child is our first concern and priority. Camp programs are not without risk, but we aim to minimize this and maximize fun through effective staff training, mandatory safety procedures, and quality supervision. Cedarkirk has a first aid center and every staff member is certified in first aid, CPR, and the use of an AED. Emergency response facilities are located minutes from camp and a regional hospital is just over 10 miles away. Camper medications are kept locked and dispensed by the on-site healthcare specialist. All activities with increased risk are supervised by a skilled, experienced staff member trained and certified in that particular activity. Pool use and off-site water activities are monitored by certified lifeguards. Some Cedarkirk programs involve off-site travel; these campers will travel in Cedarkirk vehicles driven by directors or trained staff over the age of 21.

SCHOLARSHIPS

We believe that every child who wants to come to camp should be able to attend. If you are in need of financial help to send your child to camp, scholarship money is available to assist you. Be sure to also speak with your pastor or church educator: they often have money budgeted to help families pay for camp. Scholarship money is awarded for one camp session per camper each summer and is entirely confidential. You may print a scholarship application from the summer camp page at www.cedarkirk.org.

WITHDRAWAL & CANCELLATION POLICY

We understand that complications arise and you may have to withdraw your child from their program. The initial \$75 deposit is non-refundable and will not be returned. Cancellations made more than 14 days before the start of the program will receive a full refund (less the \$75 deposit). No refund will be given for cancellations made fewer than 14 days from the start of the program. If your child is asked to leave camp due to behavioral issues or chooses to leave for any reason, your camp fee will not be refunded. Requests for refunds due to illness will be considered on a case-by-case basis.

OUR FACILITIES

Nestled along the Alafia River, our camp and conference facilities sit on 170 acres and include air-conditioned buildings, rustic cabins (electricity and fans, but no A/C), two activity pavilions, a swimming pool, playing fields, a disc golf course, outdoor worship spaces, and many activities. SUMMER WEATHER

We try to provide the opportunity for all campers to participate in every activity available for their age group. However, due to Florida's summer weather pattern of rain and thunderstorms, some activities may not be possible to complete during your child's week at camp. Counselors are trained in teaching and leading alternate indoor activities during such times. In spite of rainy days, campers have fun playing and laughing inside Cedarkirk's facilities.

ROOMMATES

Some campers may wish to have a specific roommate during their stay at camp, but a huge part of the camp experience is making new friends and developing community within a group. The majority of Cedarkirk campers do not come to camp with a roommate, but you may request ONE roommate (this request will be honored only if BOTH parties request each other). Requests for more than one roommate are not guaranteed. It is our policy to place siblings in separate groups, when possible, unless we are advised otherwise. Cedarkirk invites all campers to come with an openness to new experiences and relationships.



Tiered Pricing



WHY THREE PRICES?

You will see three prices listed for most camp programs (see the table to the right). Cedarkirk's voluntary tiered pricing structure is intended to help families recognize how much a week at camp really costs and then select the level of payment most appropriate for their circumstances. Cedarkirk's summer programs are supported with surplus monies generated by our year-round retreat ministry and the gifts of donors. A tiered pricing model allows families an option to more fully support the total cost of their child attending camp, if they are financially able. As you think about selecting a program for your child, please consider the three tiers and choose the best fit for your family.

TIER I is Cedarkirk's historic program rate and does not reflect the full per-camper cost associated with providing a summer program.

TIER II is an approximate midpoint between the historic program rate and the full cost of providing a program for each camper.

TIER III closely accounts for the full cost of providing Cedarkirk's summer programs for each camper.

MULTI-SESSION DISCOUNT:

If one week of camp just isn't enough for you, register for a second week (or third, or fourth!) and receive 10% off the price of that camp. The 10% discount will be applied automatically to any additional camps the camper signs up for this summer.

How to Register



Online registration for all programs is available at www.cedarkirk.org!

ONLINE REGISTRATION allows you to view current program availability and pay your deposit with a credit/debit card. A \$75 non-refundable deposit is required at the time of registration to secure your child's spot. You will also be able to fill out or print all supplemental forms, which are required for attendance at Cedarkirk.

MAIL-IN REGISTRATION is available for those who prefer it. Print a form from the "Summer Forms" page of our website.

PLEASE NOTE:

ALL forms required for attendance at Cedarkirk must be completed and returned two weeks before your camp session begins along with any remaining balance due. If your payment and forms are not received 14 days prior to the start of your child's program, he or she may be removed to make room for a camper on the wait list.

Meal of Simplicity

Each week of the summer, we serve a simple lunch of beans, rice, and tortillas (with a PB&J option) so our campers can see what is standard fare for many in our world and prompt discussion about poverty issues and food justice. The money we save by preparing a simple meal each week is used to support hunger organizations in our communities and around the world.

This summer, we will donate that money to Heifer International, an organization committed to ending hunger and poverty around the globe in a way that is sustainable and healthy for the planet. Heifer International empowers families to turn hunger and poverty into hope and prosperity by blending training in sustainable agriculture and commerce by means of donations of animals, livestock, and agricultural resources. Consequently, families are provided a source of food and income, as products of their labor (like milk, honey, or eggs) can be traded or sold. The organization's distribution model also requires recipients to train others in their area and pass along offspring from their animals and seeds from their crops so that a single donation can be multiplied across a community.

Cedarkirk's CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

Cedarkirk has exciting things planned for the future! This Capital Campaign will help us keep up with the increase in usage we've experienced over the past decade and better serve all guests that come to Cedarkirk for retreat and recreation. WHAT are we building?

- New single-level dining hall (with 250 seat capacity)
- Centralized office and administrative space
- Additional adult-friendly retreat cottage
- Renovations to Cedar Lodge for enhanced meeting space

WHY are we building?

- Current dining hall presents challenging access for persons with mobility issues
- Existing dining facilities can no longer accommodate increasing demand
- Meeting space is extremely limited for programmatic and guest use
